1. CitationThis instrument is the *Prohibition on Fishing (Bardi Jawi Gaarra Marine Park) Order 2025*.**2. Commencement**

This instrument comes into operation as follows—

3. Interpretation

In this order—

commercial operations licence has the same meaning as in the *Conservation and Land Management Regulations 2002*;

crab means fish of that common name described by the scientific classification opposite that name in Division 3 of Schedule 7 to the regulations;

mackerel means fish of that common name described by the scientific classification opposite that name in Division 1 of Schedule 7 to the regulations;

Sanctuary area means a zone or zones specified in Schedule 1;

sea cucumber means fish of that common name described by the scientific classification opposite that name in Division 5 of Schedule 7 to the regulations;

Special Purpose area (biocultural conservation) means a zone or zones specified in Schedule 3;

Special Purpose area (cultural protection) means a zone or zones specified in Schedule 2;

specimen shell has the same meaning as in the *Specimen Shell Managed Fishery Management Plan 1995*;

trochus means fish of that common name described by the scientific classification opposite that name in Division 4 of Schedule 7 to the regulations.

4. Prohibitions on fishing

- (1) A person must not fish by any means in a Sanctuary area.
- (2) A person must not fish by any means in a Special Purpose area (cultural protection).
- (3) A person must not fish for a commercial purpose in a Special Purpose area (biocultural conservation).

5. Exceptions to prohibitions

- (1) Clause 4(1) does not apply with respect to a person engaged in customary fishing.
 - (2) Clause 4(2) does not apply with respect to a person—
 - (a) engaged in customary fishing; or
 - (b) taking trochus for a commercial purpose; or

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954*Town of Cambridge***FIREBREAK NOTICE 2025 / 2026 TO ALL PROPERTY OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS**

Pursuant to Section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, you are hereby required, on or before **1 November 2025** or within 14 days of becoming the owner or occupier after **30 September 2025**, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you, all flammable material and/or clear firebreaks in accordance with the following land areas and thereafter to maintain that land or firebreaks up to and including **31 March 2026**—

Where the area of the land is less than 2,000 square metres—

Slash/mow all grass to a height no greater than five (5) centimetres and remove all slashed materials and other flammable matter from the land. This standard must be maintained until **31 March 2026**.

Where the area of the land is greater than 2,000 square metres—

Slash/mow all grass to a height no greater than five (5) centimetres and remove all slashed materials and/or install a firebreak of three (3) metres wide, clear of all bush and flammable material along all external boundaries of the land. This standard must be maintained until **31 March 2026**.

If it is considered impracticable to clear a firebreak or to remove flammable material from the land as required by this notice, an application to the Town of Cambridge in writing may be made prior to **13 October 2025**, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions, or to take alternative action to mitigate the fire hazard. Until written permission is received from the Town, compliance with this notice is required.

Burning off is strictly prohibited within the Town of Cambridge. The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of up to \$5,000. If the works are not carried out by the date required in this notice, the owner of the land is liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay all costs for performing the works directed in this notice.

FIREBREAK NOTICE

This notice is made pursuant to section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* (the Act). The purpose of the Notice is to prevent the outbreak, spread or expansion of a bush fire within the district. The Notice applies to all owners/occupiers of land within the district.

Owners/occupiers of land must comply with the requirements of this Notice between 1 December and 15 May inclusive. A penalty of up to \$5,000 applies for non-compliance with this notice. Shire Rangers will begin inspecting properties from 1 December. In the case of non-compliance, owners/occupiers are liable to pay the costs of any work carried out by the Shire's contractors in order to bring the property into compliance.

All Properties less than 4,000m²

- All grasses and weeds (alive or dead) across the entirety of the property must be maintained to a height of 50mm or less.

All properties between 4,000m² and 40ha

- A 3m wide firebreak with a 4m high vertical axis must be constructed within the property as close as possible to all boundaries, but no further than 50m from boundaries.
- A 3m wide firebreak with a 4m high vertical axis must be constructed immediately surrounding all outbuildings, sheds, haystacks, groups of buildings and fuel depots/storage areas situated on the property.
- All grasses and weeds (alive or dead) within 20m of a dwelling or habitable building cut and maintained to a height of 50mm or less.
- A 3m wide compacted or sealed driveway being maintained between any dwelling/habitable building and the road. The driveway to have a 4m high vertical axis clear of overhanging vegetation.

Properties greater than 40ha

- A 3m wide firebreak with a 4m high vertical axis must be constructed within the property as close as possible to the boundary where that boundary abuts a road reserve or other type of reserve managed by the Crown or the Shire, but no further than 50m from that boundary.
- Property owners are encouraged to construct firebreaks in suitable locations within their property to protect life and buildings.
- A 3m wide firebreak with a 4m high vertical axis must be constructed immediately surrounding all outbuildings, sheds, haystacks, groups of buildings and fuel depots/storage areas situated on the property.
- All grasses and weeds (alive or dead) within 20m of a dwelling or habitable building being cut and maintained to a height of 50mm or less.
- A 3m wide compacted or sealed driveway being maintained between any dwelling/habitable building and the road. The driveway to have a 4m high vertical axis clear of overhanging vegetation.
- Active pasture growth management within paddocks must be carried out by way of animal grazing or by mechanical means (slashing, cutting, mowing, ploughing). Where this is not undertaken, a 3m wide firebreak with a 4m high vertical axis must be constructed within the property as close as possible to all boundaries, but no further than 50m from boundaries.

Variation to Notice

If you consider it impractical to meet the requirements of this Notice, you may apply to the Shire for a variation. Applications must be submitted by no later than 1 November. Any applications submitted after this date will not be accepted. Please contact the Shire for an application form.

Bushfire Management Plans

Some properties in the district, especially in rural residential areas, may be subject to a Bushfire Management Plan or bushfire management conditions as a result of a development approval. The requirements of any approved Bushfire Management Plan or conditions of any development approval must also be complied with in addition to the requirements of this Notice.

Special Works Orders

The Shire may issue a Special Works Order to owners/ occupiers if, in the opinion of the Shire, a property requires extra hazard removal or reduction work in order to reduce the potential for the outbreak, spread or expansion of a bush fire.

Excessive Clearing of Vegetation

The requirement to clear vegetation to establish firebreaks in accordance with this Notice is exempt from needing approval from the Shire or a clearing permit from the State government. However, excessive clearing of vegetation to construct wider, higher or additional firebreaks is not exempt from approval.

Where properties have already had compliant firebreaks constructed, these firebreaks should be re-used the following year rather than clearing new areas. The Shire balances legislative requirements relating to bushfire protection and environmental protection. If unsure on the matter, please contact the Shire on (08) 97337800.

Plantations

- A 15m wide firebreak with a fully cleared vertical axis must be constructed around the perimeter of the planted area.
- Internal 6m wide firebreaks with a fully cleared vertical axis must be constructed to divide the planted area into areas of no more than 30,000m².

A firebreak must be constructed to achieve the specified area of horizontal and vertical width and height that is cleared of all trees, shrubs, overhanging branches, grass and other combustible material. The ground section of a firebreak must be finished as bare mineral earth.

This Notice is made pursuant to section 25 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*. The purpose of the Notice is to prevent the outbreak, spread or expansion of a bush fire within the district.

b) All land having an area greater than 1500 square metres

- (i) Clear firebreaks of a minimum width of three (3) metres inside all external boundaries of the land and all buildings situated on the land, by ploughing, cultivating or scarifying; or
- (ii) Mow/Slash the whole of the land. The height of vegetation thereafter must not exceed fifty (50) millimetres over the entire area of land, as far as reasonably practical as determined by the authorised officer.

Property inspections will be conducted during the period between **1 November and 31 March** each year, the City's Bush Fire Control Officers may conduct inspections of all properties and land within the district.

Failure to comply with the above-mentioned requirements may result in a penalty of up to \$5,000 in accordance with the *Bush Fires Act 1954*. The City may install a firebreak as outlined above, this service will be undertaken on your behalf, and the cost of this service will be invoiced to you.

Once your firebreak has been established, it must be maintained until **31 March 2026**.
