## SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING GIVES TICK OF APPROVAL FOR DEVELOPMENT TO THE JOINT DEVELOPMENT ASSESSMENT PANEL FOR DEVELOPMENT OF THE OLD COURT HOUSE/JUSTICE PRECINCT - 'THE PIER'

The proposed development site is located at the southwestern end of Robinson Street (the main street within the Carnarvon townsite) where it intersects with Olivia Terrace via a roundabout. The development site is a prominent landmark site within the Carnarvon town centre, with outlooks onto Robinson Street, along Olivia terrace, the Fascine waterway, and across to Babbage and Whitlock Islands.


The development proposal was publicly advertised pursuant to clauses 64 (1) (b) (i) and (iii), and 64 (3) (a) and (b) contained in Schedule 2 of the LPS Regs 2015, for a period of 28 days. At the conclusion of the public advertising period a total of two (2) submissions had been received.

It is a rare opportunity for a landmark site, in a regional context, to be considered viable for development. "The Pier" is intended as a benchmark regional development proposing quality urban design and desired mixed-use outcomes. It is intended to be a development of longevity, public relevance and civic significance underpinning the heart of Carnarvon.

After consideration, the officer recommendation was adopted with a couple of changes that included -

1. The planning approval timeframe increased from 2 years to 4 years as Council considers that this development, given its scale, is likely to take longer than 2 years, noting the current supply chain issues and labour shortages in the construction industry.

2. Council accepts the 143 on-site parking bays proposed by the development and considers that any additional parking demand can be accommodated by existing on-street parking within the Carnarvon town centre. This consideration is based on local knowledge and regular observations of parking demand in the town centre.

#### SHIRE OF CARNARVON ELECTRICAL SERVICES CONTRACT AWARDED

In 2016 Council awarded a contract for the provision of Electrical Services including:



- all work necessary to maintain existing electrical systems and services; and
- all new electrical systems and services installation work; at the facilities and equipment of the Shire of Carnarvon.

The second and final term of the contract expired on 22 January 2023 and therefore a tender process was undertaken seeking a suitable contractor to continue the provision of Electrical Services.

The Tender closed on 14 December 2022 with one submission being received from Carnarvon Electrics. Tenders were assessed based on the compliance criteria provided in the tender document.

Council awarded the contract to Carnarvon Electrics for a further 3 year with.

### PLUMBING CONTRACTED AWARDED GASCOYNE PLUMBING SOLUTIONS WA PTY LTD

In 2016 Council awarded a contract for the provision of Plumbing Services at the facilities and equipment of the Shire of Carnarvon including:

1. All work necessary to maintain plumbing and drainage systems and services; and

2.All new plumbing and drainage systems and services installation work

The second and final term of that contract expired on 31 January 2023. A Tender process was therefore undertaken seeking for a suitable contractor to continue provision of plumbing services. The Tender closed on 14 December 2022 with three submissions from locally based plumbers being received.

Council awarded the contract to Gascoyne Plumbing Solutions Wa Pty Ltd for a 3 year term.

## COUNCIL AWARDS NEW BAXTER PARK NATURE BASED PLAYGROUND CONTRACT TO LIGNA CONSTRUCTION

Baxter Park is a public space providing the local community with access to sport, leisure, and recreational facilities. After removal of an existing playground facility, replacement with an appropriate nature play facility is proposed.

Funding was received through the Federal Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) program to improve the Baxter Park facilities.

Tender RFT 09/2022 closed on 14 December 2022 with one submission being received from a Perth based business.

Public consultation was conducted at Baxter Park with Members of the community. Concept plans were provided and a brief presentation was conducted by Shire officers. The community was invited to provide comment.

Two comments were noted from the consultation as follows: a)Potential for repurposing the concrete slab from the decommissioned splash park – this comment has been taken on board and has merit. The relative simplicity of this element does not warrant it being include in this scope of works. Officers will finalise options for the repurposing which can be delivered in house.

b)Inclusion of wind breaks on the existing gazebo shelters – this element was included in the tender specification as a provisional item. The available budget will not allow it to proceed as specified at this stage. However, as the proposal has merit, officers will seek to include this work in any future development stages for the area.

Ligna Construction has significant experience in the industry from landscaping to construction and have delivered similar projects for other Local Governments in regional locations.

# CARNARVON SPEEDWAY CLUB BENEFITS FROM BATTERIES DISPOSED OF AT BROWNS RANGE WASTE DISPOSAL SITE

The Carnarvon Speedway Club have written to Shire Councillors and the CEO seeking reinstatement of the practice of collecting lead acid batteries from the landfill site for recycling

Historically, the Speedway Club have collected used lead acid batteries from the Browns Range landfill facility to sell as scrap metal and raise funds for the Club.

The return on scrap battery lead varies with scrap metal market fluctuations. The quantity of batteries received at the waste facility is also variable. Total year to date weight of batteries received at the waste facility is three tonnes. An approximate weight of batteries available to the Club could therefore reach six tonnes p.a. A market value of approximately \$0.66 per kilo would net the Club around \$4.000.

It is understood that the club utilises their network of members and supporters to arrange collection and transport of the batteries from the landfill to the recycler.

Officers fully support this arrangement and seek only to ensure the process is formalised.

This mutually beneficial arrangement will:

- ensure the landfill site stores only a minimum of lead acid batteries (which are around 95% recyclable);
- Minimise administrative activities associated with arranging transport, payments etc associated with the sale of the batteries; and
- provide a regular funding source for the Carnarvon Speedway Club.

Council have approved a formal arrangement for the CarnarvonSpeedway Club to collect used lead acid batteries from the Browns Range landfill site at regular intervals.



# SHIRE TO PROVIDE ROAD BASE MATERIAL FOR CONSTRUCTION OF ACCESS ROAD TO CORAL COAST HELICOPTER'S NEW HANGAR FACILITY AT CARNARVON AIRPORT

In November 2019, development approval was granted to Coral Coast Helicopters for the construction of a new hangar at Carnarvon Airport. That approval was extended for a further two years in 2021.

Construction of the new hangar began in 2022. Construction is nearing completion. The development approval includes conditions associated with:

- construction of a vehicle parking and manoeuvring area adjacent to the hanger site; and
- construction of an unsealed access road to the hangar.

At the time of the initial development approval, the Shire had a quantity of road base material available at the airport recovered from main runway remediation works. That material would have been suitable for the construction of the hangar access road

In the intervening period of three years, that road base material has been utilised for other Shire works. That was done as those projects had an immediate requirement for road base material. Use of the available material avoided purchase at the time of road base for those tangible works.

The development approval condition wording is not specific in the event of the Shire provided recovered material being no longer available for use by the applicant. It could be reasonably considered however that the approval condition places an obligation upon the Shire to provide a material for the access track. The access will ultimately become the maintenance responsibility of the Shire.

Council agreed to commit up to \$13,500 for the supply and delivery of road base material for construction of an access track at the Carnarvon Airport servicing airport facilities including the Coral Coast Helicopter's new hangar facility.

Just in time to take a seat for the Community Family Friendly Event at Town Beach for for the Australia Day fireworks these park benches were installed.


Three seats have been installed at the Town Beach Playground at the Fascine

Infrastructure projects identified to improve the overall amenity of Carnarvon and Coral Bay through the 2023 Total Solar Eclipse and beyond, led by the Shire with funding support from the Department of Jobs, Tourism, Science and Innovation (JTSI), have resulted in the majority of project contracts awarded to local contractors. The Department of Jobs, Tourism, Science and Innovation contributed \$491,000 towards projects which will improve amenities during the 2023 Total Solar Eclipse and have legacy benefits to the Shire's communities.

Projects include upgrades to ablution facilities at Town Oval, Visitors Centre and Coral Bay, addition of water supply points at Town Oval and Festival Grounds, upgrade of toilet waste systems and addition of dump points at the Festival Grounds, and the upgrades of parking facilities at Coral Bay and Town Oval.

Contracts have been awarded for each of the above projects, with local contractors selected for all but one of the jobs, which are all slated for completion prior to the April eclipse.

The Total Solar Eclipse is a rare astronomy event occurring on 20 April 2023. The best viewpoint across the globe is the Coral Coast region which will experience views of 95%-99% coverage during the eclipse.

The region is expecting a surge of Astro-tourism visitors throughout April, to be followed closely by the Gassy Dash Off-Road race hosted in Carnarvon from the 27-23 April 2023.

The Shire is excited to see these projects come to fruition and look forward to working with our local contractors to deliver these legacy projects that will provide improved amenities for the communities of Carnarvon and Coral Bay.

#### REDEVELOPMENTS UNDERWAY FOR BAXTER PARK

The Shire is excited to announce major redevelopment works for Baxter Park which will be implemented over the next six months.

These updates are designed to reinvigorate the park into an inclusive recreational space with something for everyone and have been informed by feedback from our recent public information session.

Works commenced in recent weeks with the addition of two electric barbeques, which were installed on wide concrete pads for wheelchair accessibility, and connected to existing pathways.

Further upgrades include:

Removal of the aged infrastructure of the playground and exercise equipment to make way for a new playground. Potential refurbishments to the existing gazebos to enhance the structures and include wind protection.

The redevelopment works will also see a major refurbishment of the existing toilet block to improve and upgrade the facility to DDA-compliant levels, with new plumbing, electrical fixtures and fittings, electronic timed doors, and an aesthetic update to the facility overall.

The Shire will be going out to tender for the design and construction of the new playground in the coming weeks. Requirements for the nature playground include interactive educational play, native landscaping where possible and the design to represent the local history, art, and culture.

Shire President Eddie Smith recognises the part that Local Contractors play in the project, saying: "a big thanks to our local electricians and concreter who installed the BBQ's for us, they've done a great job. We encourage our other local businesses to make a submission for the rest of the upcoming works, to 'Fix what we've got' and get these upgrades completed for the community to enjoy a BBQ lamb chop on the weekend!"

Continued improvements to Baxter Park through consideration of both health and safety and long-term viability of features has resulted in the decision to remove the existing water splash park. This is a critical health and safety decision due to the inability to provide a risk-free minimum standard for safe play. Plans to repurpose the existing concrete slab are already underway with the option of installing a basketball ring and/or painted games.

There is a master plan for future development beyond the current 6-month scope, with the objective to build on Baxter Park's ideal location as a starting point to connect to the Fascine and other town landmarks such as the heritage trail.

Thank you to the members of our community for engaging in this process with us. Your valued ideas and suggestions have been considered throughout the planning of the re-development and helps us to ensure we create a space that serves you best.

# SNAKE!

#### **IF YOU SEE A SNAKE**

- Leave it alone. Snakes are generally shy and will not attack unless provoked.
- If you see a snake inside your home, get all people and pets out of the room immediately. Keep an eye on the snake from a safe distance and call a professional snake catcher. If you are not comfortable watching the snake, close the door, fill the gap underneath with a towel while waiting for a professional.
- If you see a snake outside, watch where it goes. If it's heading for the bush or an open paddock you probably won't see it again. If it disappears into a shed or under a vehicle, then you may need to call a snake catcher.

#### TIPS FOR AVOIDING A SNAKE BITE

- Never try to catch or kill a snake yourself. This is when most bites happen.
- Remember that even little snakes can be dangerous. Baby brown snakes have venom from the time they hatch.
- Stick to the trails in national parks and reserves and make a bit of noise when you walk.
- Keep your yard clear of long grass and rubbish so snakes have nowhere to hide.
- Rats and mice are a snake's smorgasbord, so clean up after the chooks and control rodents on your property.

#### IF YOU ARE BITTEN

Always assume the snake may be venomous. Symptoms may include nausea, sweating, diarrhoea, pains in the chest and double vision.

- Apply direct pressure to the bite site with a broad bandage or improvise with clothing or the flat of your hand.
- Call an ambulance or get to a hospital as soon as possible.
- Sit quietly, as this will reduce the speed that the venom can move around your body.
- If you have a first aid kit, wrap a compression bandage tightly around the bitten limb, starting just above the fingers or toes and moving upwards on the bitten limb as far as can be reached
- Remember what the snake looked like or take a photo so the doctor can identify it.
- Do not attempt to take a live snake with you.



# DOG EXERCISE AREAS



#### How can lexercise my dog\_safely?

There are an upper of areas throughout the Shire of Carnarvon where you can exercise your dog. This map shows the on and off leash areas, as well as the prohibited areas. Reserves within the Shire of Carnarvon are clearly sign posted.

#### Wherecanlexercise mydog?

The Shire of Carnarvon has designated many reserves called 'dog exercise acras'. In these areas your dog may run freely and below are a few helpful hints to help you avoid on-the-spot-fines:

- A person capable of controlling the dog must be near the dog at all times.
- Carry a leash so it can be quickly attached to gain control of the dog.
- Remove any excreta left by the dog.
- The dog must not chase or harassany other person, animal orbird.



#### Excreta

Permitting your dog to excrete on a street, reserve, someone else's yard or other public place and failing to remove and adequately dispose of such excreta is an offence under the Shire of Carnarvon Local Laws relating to Dogs.

REMEMBER the dog must always be under effective control, so if you can't control your dog then keep it on a leash.

Other than the areas listed as dog exercise areas or prohibited areas, dogs must be on a leash at all times in a public place.

This is a requirement by law of the Dog Act 1976.

#### **CORAL BAY**

Dogs are required to be on a lead in all public areas within Coral Bay & Mauds Landing areas. No Dogs allowed on beaches (see DBCA for more information).

#### WHERE AM I NOT ALLOWED TO TAKE MY DOG?

You cannot take your dog to the following areas under the Dog Act 1976; unless it is an assistance animal under the Disabilities Act 2006:

- Public areas where there is a sporting, community or activity or event in progress or about to commence.
- Cemeteries
- Schools, college campuses
- Public Swimming Pools
- Children's Playgrounds
- Civic Centre and public buildings



#### NAIF Increases Financial Support for Yangibana Rare Earths Project to A\$220 million

#### Highlights

- Northern Australia Infrastructure Facility (NAIF) increases financial support to A\$220 million with 12½year tenor, subject to pre-completion conditions.
- NAIF's support of the Yangibana Rare Earths Project reaffirms the Australian Government's commitment for developing the growing critical minerals sector.
- NAIF loan represents more than half of ~A\$400 million of total debt financing required for Yangibana.
- Yangibana Project will supply the critical minerals enabling a lower carbon future and renewable energy solutions

Australia's next rare earths producer Hastings Technology Metals Ltd (ASX: HAS) (Hastings or the Company) is pleased to announce that it has received approval for increased financial support for the Yangibana Rare Earths Project (Yangibana), in the Gascoyne region of Western Australia.

The Federal Government's Northern Australia Infrastructure Facility (NAIF) has agreed to increase the previously announced financial support to A\$220 million, 12%-year tenor loan facility for the development of Yangibana. The loan has been approved by the NAIF Board and considered by the Federal Minister for Northern Australia, the Honourable Madeleine King.

The increased support from NAIF is in recognition of the global need for rare earth magnets required in the drive towards cleaner and renewable sources of energy. The shift towards a lower carbon future will only be achieved by having available the critical raw materials required for the technologies that deliver this outcome. Rare earth metals are integral to the manufacture of permanent magnets used in electric vehicles (EV's) and the decarbonisation of the energy sector through wind turbines as well as a host of other high-tech applications.

The NAIF loan represents more than half of the A\$400 million of total debt funding required for Yangibana and is aligned with Australia's Critical Minerals Strategy and the Western Australian Government's Future Battery Industry Strategy. The Yangibana project, which comprises a mine and beneficiation plant at the Yangibana site and a hydrometallurgical plant at the Ashburton North Strategic Industrial Area (ANSIA) near Onslow, will become Australia's second rare earths producer and expands the country's strategic capability in downstream processing of rare earths minerals.

Hastings is well advanced on construction of the enabling infrastructure at Yangibana ahead of commencing plant construction in 2023 and has commenced site works at the Onslow hydrometallurgical plant site. Activity levels at both sites will increase substantially during 2023 as plant construction commences and the construction workforce expands.

Yangibana will support a peak construction workforce of nearly 500 in the Upper Gascoyne and Lower Pilbara regions of Western Australia and create more than 250 steady state operational jobs at commencement of operations. Significant public benefits to the Gascoyne region will be delivered through commitments Hastings is making with regards to local employment and business opportunities, upgrading of roads and installation of common communications infrastructure.

#### Charles Lew, Hastings' Executive Chairman, said:

"Hastings is very pleased with the increased support from the Northern Australia Infrastructure Facility for the Yangibana Rare Earths Project. The higher loan quantum is recognition of the significant work that Hastings has done to progress construction activities to become Australia's next rare earth producer.

Hastings is advancing the Yangibana Rare Earths Project in parallel with progressing the Hastings 2.0 mine-to-magnet strategy with a clear focus on delivering the critical minerals required for decarbonisation technologies into a strategically aligned supply chain.

The increased NAIF loan and the financial support from Wyloo Metals via the recent \$150M Exchangeable Note reinforces Hastings continued progress to have Yangibana fully funded in conjunction with its strategy of developing an integrated mine to magnet supply chain that is responsibly sourced, ESG compliant and aligns with the critical minerals strategies of Australia and the European Union."

This announcement has been approved by the Board for release to the ASX.






