NEW CEO ON BOARD 22 OCTOBER 2024

The Shire of Carnarvon is pleased to announce the successful appointment of its new Chief Executive Officer, Amanda Dexter, who will officially commence her role on 22 October 2024.

The recruitment process was conducted in full compliance with the Shire's adopted standards for CEO Recruitment, Performance, and Termination, as outlined in the Local Government Act and relevant regulations.

At a Special Council Meeting held on 7 May 2024, the Council endorsed the CEO recruitment process along with associated matters. Following this, on 16 July 2024, the CEO Selection Panel presented its confidential Chief Executive Officer Recruitment Report at another Special Council Meeting, where the Shire President was authorised to execute the employment contract with the selected candidate.

The Council is pleased to confirm that the preferred applicant, Amanda Dexter, accepted the employment offer on 16 July 2024. With her appointment, the Council is confident in her ability to provide strong leadership and contribute meaningfully to the continued growth and success of the Shire of Carnarvon.

The recruitment process adhered strictly to the Shire of Carnarvon's adopted standards, and the finalisation of the employment contract marks the successful conclusion of this process.

COMMUNITY GROUPS BENEFIT FROM COMMUNITY GROWTH FUNDING FOR ROUND 2

Applications submitted for Round 2 of the 2024 Community Growth Fund and Outgoing Sponsorship, which closed on 12 August 2024 were assessed. A total of five applications were received for the Community Growth Fund, amounting to \$24,700.38, and five applications were received for Outgoing Sponsorship, totalling \$45,000.

The Community Growth Fund Committee consists of Elected Members. Shire staff provide administrative support to the Committee by receiving applications, preparing reports for the Committee meeting, obtaining further information required from applicants, and preparing the reports with the Committee's recommendations for endorsement by Council. Shire staff also provide advice and guidance to applicants to assist with their Community Growth Fund applications.

The Shire was proactive in promoting the Community Growth Fund and the Outgoing Sponsorship opportunity and application process through social media, email outreach, and updates on the Shire's website. Community groups were invited to meet with Shire officers to discuss applications before submissions as per the guidelines.

The Council allocates funding for the Community Growth Fund as part of its annual budget process. In this round, a total of \$24,700.38 has been requested through Community Growth Fund applications, and \$45,000 has been requested through Outgoing Sponsorship applications, bringing the total requested amount to \$69,770.38. There are two more rounds of funding scheduled for October 2024 and January 2025.

FASCINE WALL CAPPING BEAM REPLACEMENT WORKS

The Shire of Carnarvon wishes to advise residents and visitors that its contractor First Class Construction (WA) will commence works replacing the Fascine Wall Capping beam sections this week. Contract works is expected to be completed by 31 October 2024.

The capping beam is the 650mm wide section of concrete on the lower footpath area closest to the water edge.

Work will commence at the Baxter Park end of the Fascine and progress north. Work will be completed in sections. This will require sections of the lower footpath to be closed to pedestrians while capping beam replacement works is in progress. Short term closures of the upper fascine wall footpath may also be required. Barrier fencing will be installed around works areas. Please follow all signage and keep clear of work areas.

This project is funded by the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) program, through the Federal Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts.

We will continue to keep the community informed as these works progress. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation and apologise for any inconvenience.

CARNARVON IMPROVING FLOOD PREPAREDNESS

The Carnarvon Local Government Area in Western Australia is a high-risk location for tropical cyclones and associated flooding.

The Shire of Carnarvon's Flood Preparedness project aims to increase the community's ability to withstand and lessen the effects of flooding and tropical cyclones.

Project activities will include a combination of infrastructure works on the Carnarvon flood levee system and related planning activities to the riverbank and floodways to reduce potential flood damages and technical investigations to better understand flood risks and support effective preparation for flood events.

Project benefits

- Improved flood protection created from upgrades to flood infrastructure.
- Improved understanding of flood behaviour and risk to recognise the impacts of floods on the community and enable effective decisions to be made on flood management.
- Readily available information on flood risk so that government, risk managers and community can make informed risk management and investment decisions.
- Improved understanding of how to maintain the natural flood functions within the floodplain to enable effective flood risk management and mitigate environmental impacts.
- Improved survey data and updated flood modelling to using latest climate change projections support local emergency managers and community to better plan and respond to future flood events.
- Improve community resilience to flooding through the appropriate consideration of flood risk to new development and redevelopment.
- Assessment of potential additional structural mitigation options to further reduce flood risk.

Community feedback

Throughout the project, activities to reduce flooding will be identified on private and public land. Study outcomes, and medium and long-term remediation and flood mitigation activities will be identified in a River Care and Floodway Management Plan. The community will be asked to provide feedback on the proposed activities in the River Care and Floodway Management Plan in late 2024.

Works we will be completing from September – December 2024

Throughout the next few months, we will start investigative works to inform what's needed. Some construction works on levees will also begin. All works will be on public land in and around Carnarvon.

During this time, we'll carry out

- Construction works to repair the East Carnarvon Levee, Morgan Town Levee, Carnarvon Airport Levee and Robinson Street Levee
- Replacement of damaged flood gates at the Carnarvon Airport levee
- Geotechnical investigations at the East Carnarvon and Morgan Town levees
- Stability investigations on all the Town levees

In the Carnarvon Horticultural District, the following works are planned for late 2024/early 2025

- Riverbank erosion repair
- Sheridan's Gully levee repair
- Removing vegetation causing obstruction in Lyall's Gully, Fahl's Gully and Lewers Creek.

What to expect

The works will be on public property only.

- Increased vehicle activity
- Noise from machinery
- Access to properties will be maintained at all times.

COUNCIL ACCEPTS FUNDING FROM DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORT FOR AIRPORT UPGRADES

The Shire of Carnarvon is pleased to announce that it has secured funding from the Department of Transport to facilitate critical upgrades to the Carnarvon Airport. This funding, up to \$8 million, has been approved as part of the 2024-2025 State Budget and will be used to ensure the airport's pavement is suitable for unrestricted operations of REX Airlines Dash Q400 aircraft.

In September 2023, the Shire of Carnarvon approved a temporary pavement concession allowing REX to operate the Dash Q400 at the Carnarvon Airport. The current concession, which is set to expire in October 2024, will require an extension until the completion of the planned upgrades.

The decision to approve the concession was informed by a detailed pavement inspection conducted by Regional Airport Management Services, an independent agency engaged by the Department of Transport. Subsequent inspections have taken place at three-month intervals since the Q400 operations began, with the latest inspection in July 2024 confirming that no material defects have been identified in the airport's pavement.

Following the assessments, Regional Airport Management Services recommended a series of upgrade works, estimating the total project cost at \$8 million. The proposed upgrades will allow for unrestricted operation of the Q400 aircraft and ensure the longevity and safety of the airport's infrastructure.

The first step in the upgrade process will be to engage a qualified and experienced Project Manager. This individual will play a pivotal role in delivering the project, including:

- Preparing the scope of works and terms of reference for the engagement of an Independent Technical Expert, as required under the funding agreement.
- Drafting the necessary designs, technical specifications, and tender documentation.
- Providing technical advice to prospective tenderers and participating in the tender evaluation process.
- Acting as the contract Superintendent during construction, ensuring all works are completed to the required standards.
- Working collaboratively with the Independent Technical Expert to ensure timely submission of milestone claim information for funding payments.

As always, the Shire of Carnarvon remains committed to maintaining and upgrading vital infrastructure to ensure long-term sustainability and improved services for the community. These planned upgrades will allow continued safe and efficient operations at Carnarvon Airport, benefiting both residents and visitors alike.

WAYNE AND JEANETTE CARNARVON'S LOCAL HEROES CHAMPIONING CLEAN STREETS

Wayne and Jeanette Taylor are making a remarkable impact as the heart and soul behind Carnarvon's Litter Legends, a community-led initiative focused on keeping the town clean and beautiful. 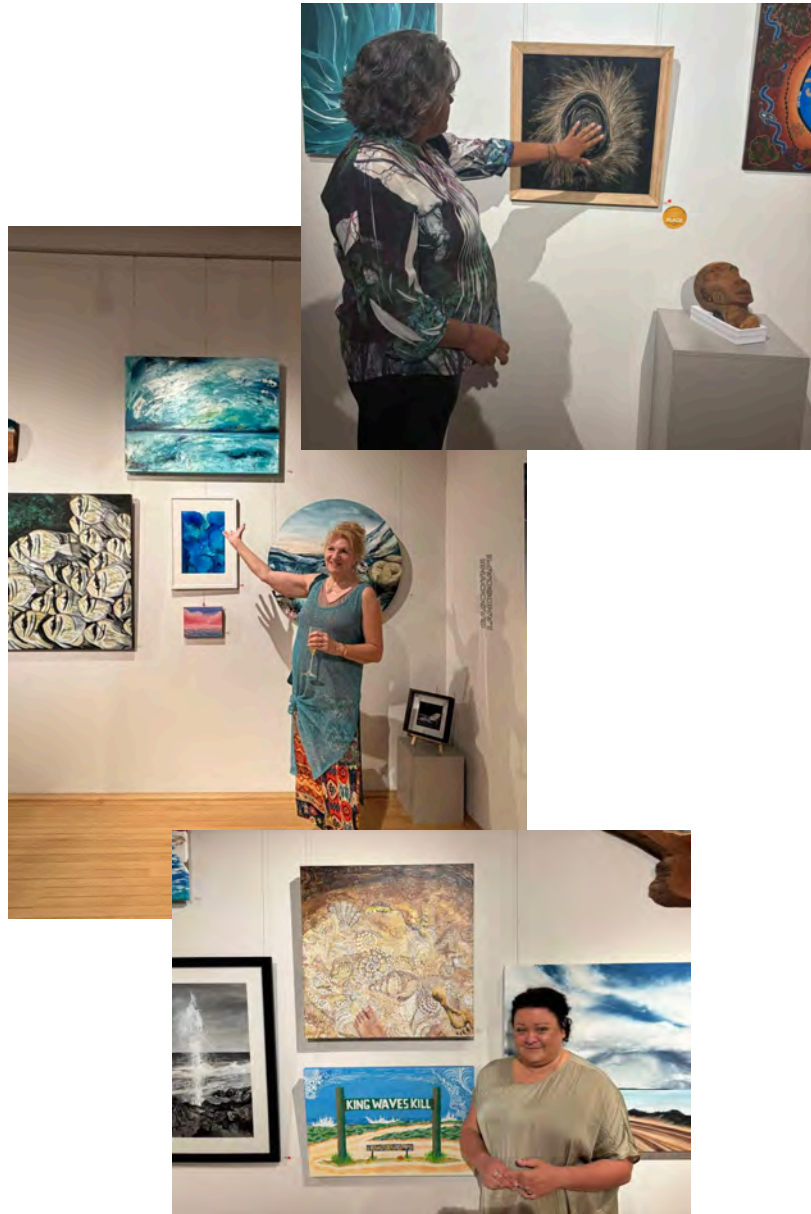

CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR NEWEST AUSTRALIANS

Welcome to our new Australians who all took the Oath of Allegiance at a Citizenship Ceremony held at the Library/Art Gallery on 17 September 2024 (Australian Citizenship Day). We had 4 conferees sworn in by Shire President Eddie Smith and witnessed by the Acting CEO Mr Alan Thornton, comprising conferees from New Zealand, Fiji and the Solomon Islands.

History of Australian Citizenship Day

Australian Citizenship Day was first celebrated in 2001. The Australian Government established the day in 2001 in response to a recommendation by the Australian Citizenship Council in their 2000 report Australian Citizenship for a New Century. The recommendation came from a proposal of the 1999 National Schools Constitutional Convention that a citizenship day be established to allow all Australians to celebrate their Australian citizenship. 17 September was chosen as Australian Citizenship Day as it is the anniversary of the renaming, in 1973, of the Nationality and Citizenship Act 1948 to the Australian Citizenship Act 1948.

Acquiring Australian Citizenship is a public declaration of commitment to Australia and enables those doing so to participate fully in our inclusive society, realise aspirations and achieve their full potential, regardless of their race, background, gender, religion, language or place of birth. Citizenship is a public commitment to embracing Australian values and institutions. Citizenship brings responsibilities and duties - to obey the laws, to register on the Electoral Roll and vote, to serve on a jury if called to do so, and to defend Australia should the need arise. Citizenship also brings civil and social rights, the right to express peoples cultural heritage and beliefs coupled with a responsibility to accept the rights of others to express their heritage and beliefs.

Snake!

IF YOU SEE A SNAKE

- Leave it alone. Snakes are generally shy and will not attack unless provoked.
- If you see a snake inside your home, get all people and pets out of the room immediately. Keep an eye on the snake from a safe distance and call a professional snake catcher. If you are not comfortable watching the snake, close the door, fill the gap underneath with a towel while waiting for a professional.
- If you see a snake outside, watch where it goes. If it's heading for the bush or an open paddock you probably won't see it again. If it disappears into a shed or under a vehicle, then you may need to call a snake catcher.


TIPS FOR AVOIDING A SNAKE BITE

- Never try to catch or kill a snake yourself. This is when most bites happen.
- Remember that even little snakes can be dangerous. Baby brown snakes have venom from the time they hatch.
- Stick to the trails in national parks and reserves and make a bit of noise when you walk.
- Keep your yard clear of long grass and rubbish so snakes have nowhere to hide.
- Rats and mice are a snake's smorgasbord, so clean up after the chooks and control rodents on your property.

IF YOU ARE BITTEN

Always assume the snake may be venomous. Symptoms may include nausea, sweating, diarrhoea, pains in the chest and double vision.

- Apply direct pressure to the bite site with a broad bandage or improvise with clothing or the flat of your hand.
- Call an ambulance or get to a hospital as soon as possible.
- Sit quietly, as this will reduce the speed that the venom can move around your body.
- If you have a first aid kit, wrap a compression bandage tightly around the bitten limb, starting just above the fingers or toes and moving upwards on the bitten limb as far as can be reached.
- Remember what the snake looked like or take a photo so the doctor can identify it.
- Do not attempt to take a live snake with you.



SNAKE BITE TREATMENT
In 4 quick steps

1 Place wound dressing on bite site.
Immediately apply a firm pressure bandage over the bite site. Do not wash venom off the skin as it will assist in later identification.

2 Bandage over the wound and bandage up the limb covering the entire limb and then back down towards the wrist/ankle. Use the Pen provided to mark the bite puncture marks on the outside of the bandage.

3 Bandage should be firm. Keep the body and limb as still as possible. Do not elevate the limb.

4 Immobilise the limb as best possible. If the bite is on the forearm, put the affected arm in a sling.

Reassure the patient and keep them calm. Many snakes are quite harmless.

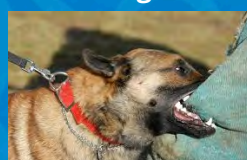
SEEK URGENT MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

WARNING: you must not wash the patient, remove the bandage or apply a tourniquet.
CHECK CIRCULATION AT REGULAR INTERVALS.

REMEMBER

Snakes are protected native animals and it is illegal to kill them unless there is a direct threat to human life. Snakes have an important place in our ecosystem, especially in controlling rats and mice. Snakes are not aggressive animals, they are purely defensive animals. If you corner or try to capture them, they can't kick or punch, there is only one thing they can do and it's bite you.

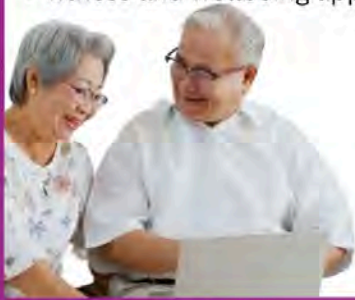

NOTICE OF 1080 BAITING

The Carnarvon Rangelands Biosecurity Association Inc. (CRBA) wishes to advise residents and travellers that during September & October 2024 a community ground & aerial baiting program, using 1080 meat baits to control wild dogs will be carried out by pastoralists on pastoral leases across the Local Government areas of CARNARVON, EXMOUTH, MURCHISON, SHARK BAY, and UPPER GASCOYNE. Selected pastoral and DBCA-managed lands within the Local Government Areas of NORTHAMPTON and GERALDTON (Mullewa locality) are also included in this program.

Additional intermittent ground baiting on pastoral leases, DBCA-managed land, and Unallocated Crown Land (UCL) is also carried out at any time throughout the year in these areas.

Please treat all indicated land as containing toxic baits year-round. Take care when working within or visiting these areas.

Domestic pets should be kept close and under control at all times. All roads in this region pass through pastoral leases or DBCA-managed land. Please keep domestic pets on a leash and close to the road to avoid the poisoned meat baits. It is unlawful for domestic pets to run free on DBCA-managed land.

1080 baiting is an integral part of the wild dog pest management program and assists the region's landholders in meeting their legal obligation under the BAM Act 2007. Pastoralists undertake these poisoning programs to protect livestock from death and injury caused by wild dogs. DBCA participates in this work as part of its Good Neighbour Policy. Unfortunately, there is no antidote for 1080 if poisoning of domestic pets does occur.

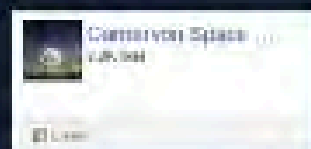

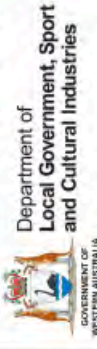

Carnarvon's traditional owners are the Yinggarda people, who named this area long ago, Kuwinywardu (Gwoonwardu), meaning 'neck of water'. The first European settlement was established in 1876 setting up the pastoral station known as "Brickhouse Station".

By 1881 there were several pastoral stations set up, including the well-known Brown Range station and the Brockman Station, which led to the region being declared a municipality. Gascoyne Roads Board was set up in 1882. Later to become the Lower Gascoyne Roads Board. The Shire of Carnarvon was established in 1965 with CW Tuckey elected as the first Shire President on the 1st March 1965.
