FROM THE DECEMBER 2024 COUNCIL MEETING

CORAL BAY SETTLEMENT STRUCTURE PLAN REVIEW - STAGE 1

Council resolved to review Stage 1 of the Coral Bay Settlement Structure Plan (CBSSP), specifically focusing on the review of the bed number cap and the development capacity of zoned land in Coral Bay. The (CBSSP) was originally developed to provide a strategic framework for the orderly and sustainable development of the area.

Preliminary public consultation was carried out during the months of April and May 2024, mainly through one-on-one stakeholder workshops and surveys.

Council was provided with three options for revising the bed number cap, each with varying implications for development, infrastructure, and environmental management. These options are designed to balance growth with sustainability.

Council resolved to adopt the report prepared by Hames Sharley and progress with Option 2 - Bed Cap Flexibility. This option could allow for incremental increased tourism and workers accommodation to occur, provided that the impacts on the environment, infrastructure and the community can be accounted for.



DATES SET FOR 2025 ORDINARY COUNCIL, AUDIT & RISK COMMITTEE AND MAJOR PROJECTS COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Under the Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996, Council is required to set dates, times and venues of Ordinary Meetings and those meetings that are open to the public the upcoming calendar year and provide local public notice of the schedule.

Council adopted the 2025 schedule of meetings and these meetings will be advertised and appear on Council's website and the Shire newsletter.

As of January 2025, the Council Meetings will now commence at 9.00am and not 1.00pm as has previously been advertised. The community are reminded that the meetings are open to the public and you can ask questions on any topic during the Public Question Time Session at the beginning of the meeting.

The next meeting of Council will be held on Tuesday 28 January 2024 in Council Chambers, Stuart Street commencing at 9.00am.

LOCAL PLANNING SCHEME NO. 13 -AMENDMENT 9 APPROVED TO ALLOW CARETAKERS DWELLING IN HILL STREET

The Shire received a proposal from Dowling Guidici and Associates with regards to amending the local planning scheme to allow an additional use (Caretaker's Dwelling) on the properties located at 9 and 11 Hill Street Carnarvon that are currently zoned Commercial.

A scheme amendment was subsequently prepared to enable the Shire to consider future development applications for caretaker dwellings on these properties.

The amendment was endorsed by Council and will be referred to the EPA and Department of Planning for endorsement

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF ROBINSON STREET CORAL BAY JANUARY TO APRIL 2025

The Shire of Carnarvon wishes to advise the community and visitors that a section of Robinson Street in Coral Bay will be temporarily closed to all traffic from 13 January 2025 to 5 April 2025 to facilitate reconstruction works associated as part of the RAC Ningaloo Reef Resort redevelopment.

This exciting redevelopment, led by RAC, includes enhancements to the public road and adjacent facilities, ensuring long-term benefits for both pedestrians and vehicles in Coral Bay.

Key Information:

Scope of Works

- Installation of a towing vehicle turnaround area at the end of Robinson Street,
- New asphalt surfacing for road and parking areas,
- Construction of new kerbing, drainage, footpaths, pedestrian crossings
- Additional vehicle parking.

Road Closure

- The affected section of Robinson Street will be closed to all vehicles.
- Road Users are advised to follow signage and traffic controller directions.

Beach Access

• Pedestrian access to the beach will remain open two existing beach access paths.

Timeline

• Work will commence on 13 January and be completed by 5 April 2025 in time for the Easter 2025 school holidays.

While the Shire recognises the potential inconvenience this temporary closure may cause, these works are critical to delivering enhanced vehicle and pedestrian facilities that will benefit Coral Bay for years to come.



AMENDMENT OF FEES AND CHARGES – DISPOSAL OF CONCRETE

The Shire wishes to advise that from 1 January 2025, the fee to dispose of concrete containing metal reinforcing will change for commercial operators and businesses. This change supports the Shire's recycling practices by encouraging separation of concrete free from metal reinforcing.

The Shire's waste facility is equipped with a crusher bucket attachment for its excavator, enabling the efficient processing of non-reinforced concrete into reusable material. This crushed concrete is utilised on-site to maintain internal roads and tracks, demonstrating a practical and sustainable recycling method.



The amendment to the Shire's Fees and Charges is as follows:



PELICAN POINT DUNES REMAIN

The Shire of Carnarvon has extended vehicle access restrictions at Pelican Point Beach to support ongoing dune stabilisation and vegetation recovery efforts.

Initially implemented in November 2023, these measures have shown promising signs of environmental restoration. However, additional time is required to ensure the success of these initiatives.

The community's cooperation has been instrumental in protecting this valuable coastal area. The Shire plans to conduct another review in 12 months to assess progress.

Previously, in January 2023, the Shire restricted vehicle access to Pelican Point Beach to protect vegetation and potential turtle nesting sites.

The Shire appreciates the community's continued support in preserving this important natural asset.

RESPONSIBLE DOG AND CAT OWNERSHIP

The Shire of Carnarvon encourages responsible pet ownership and enforces cat and dog ownership guidelines as stated in the Dog Act 1976, Dog Regulations 2013, Shire of Carnarvon Dogs Local Law 2021, Cat Act 2011 and the Shire of Carnarvon Cats Local Law 2021.

Rangers may impose on-the-spot fines and impound dogs for breaches of the Dog and Cat Acts. As of 1 November 2013, all domestic cats in Western Australia, over six months of age, need to be sterilised, micro-chipped and registered with their local government as per the Cat Act 2011.

Dogs are also required to be microchipped and registered with their local government as per the Dog Amendment Bill 2013. We encourage all dog owners to sterilise their pets to prevent them from contributing to the increasing population of unwanted animals. Pet owners have specific legal responsibilities, which are intended for the convenience of all the community, as well as the health and well-being of your animals.

DOG OWNERSHIP

You must ensure your dog is:

- currently registered (if over three months of age)
- micro-chipped
- wears a collar displaying name, address, phone number and registration tag.
- confined to the premises at which it lives or is temporarily residing.
- under the control of a competent person.
- only exercised off the leash in a designated area and is under verbal control. You must carry a leash.
- control, trained and restrained to prevent wandering, excessive barking, aggression and attacks of other animals or people.



LIMITATION OF DOG NUMBERS

- The limit on the number of dogs which may be kept on any premises is 2, for the purpose of Section 26(4) of the Dog Act. No exemption shall be granted to the owner or occupier of any premises if the premises by reason of inadequate fencing, size, location or detrimental effect on any other premises, would be inappropriate for the housing of three to six dogs.
- Upon request the Local Government may grant an exemption in relation to any particular premises under Section 26(3) of the Act, to house three to six dogs at one property.
- Request for exemptions can only be approved by delegated authority.
- Fee: \$150 per application

CAT OWNERSHIP

- Cat Act 2011 <u>Cat Act 2011 [00-c0-01]</u>
- All cats must be microchipped, registered and sterilised.

Hire of cat traps may be available for the capture of nuisance and or feral cats.

PARTIAL CLOSURE OF TRAMWAY BRIDGE DUE TO STRUCTURAL CONCERNS

The Shire of Carnarvon has announced the partial closure of the Tramway Bridge, effective immediately, due to structural concerns. This decision follows routine assessments which idenitified otential safety risks associated with the current condition.

The Tramway Historical Bridge, a major part of Carnarvon's eritage, holds significant importance for both the local community and visitors to the region. As part of ongoing structural reviews, works were originally scheduled for April, May, and June 2025. However, due to the extent of deterioration, the Shire has made the difficult decision to prioritise public safety by restricting access to the western side of the bridge.

Built in 1899, the Tramway Bridge served the community until 1984 as a vital connection to the One Mile Jetty. Initially a key route for major imports and exports before the advancement of road transport and the cessation of port facilities, the bridge now stands as a poignant reminder of its role in Carnarvon's history over the past 125 years. The Shire is committed to restoring this historic structure for the enjoyment of current and future generations.

The Shire is actively evaluating the extent of the structural issues and planning restoration options. Community members are encouraged to stay updated via official channels regarding the bridge's status and upcoming developments.



INVITATION TO JOIN CONCUSSION STUDY



The Australian Mild Traumatic Brain Injury (AUSmTBI) study is a national endeavour that is developing an online tool to improve care and recovery for people who suffer a mild traumatic brain injury (mTBI) or concussion.

While most people recover fully within a few days or weeks after a concussion injury, for some, the recovery process may be longer and symptoms debilitating. A major problem is that there is currently no way to predict how long recovery will take.

The AUS-mTBI study will identify what predicts recovery after concussion by analysing data collected through the AUS-mTBI section of the HeadCheck app, an evidence-based concussion management app.

The app can be downloaded for free from the App Store or Google Play, or accessed via the web-based platform at https://app.headcheck.com.au/home

By clicking on the link to the AUS-mTBI study in HeadCheck, you can help improve care and outcomes for others who get a concussion in the future. Participants will also be able to get guidance and track their own recovery through a unique symptom tracking tool.

To thank participants for completing the study, they will go into a draw with the chance to win one of five Visa gift cards (see the AUS-mTBI website for details).

The AUS-mTBI study is being led by John Curtin Distinguished Professor Melinda Fitzgerald. Project partners include Curtin University, Murdoch Children's Research Institute, Monash University, Edith Cowan University, The Queensland Brain Institute, Griffith University, The University of Sydney, Deakin University, the National Imaging Facility, brain injury organisation Synapse Australia Limited, and software company Curve Tomorrow.



CYCLONE - BE PREPARED!

- On average five cyclones occur off Western Australia's (WA) north-west coast each year, of these, two directly impact the coast and affect local communities. In Western Australia (WA) cyclone season starts in November and continues through to April. During this time coastal regions of WA are at risk of being impacted by cyclones.
- Preparing your family and your property for a cyclone is your responsibility, this includes being familiar with the meanings of cyclone alerts and warnings. People also need to take proper precautions and responsibility for their own welfare, prepare property inside and out and develop a cyclone plan to ensure their safety.
- Planning before the cyclone season can help save lives, minimise property damage and help your family to cope during a cyclone.
- Experiencing a cyclone can be frightening and traumatic. After a cyclone, many essential services may not be working, roads may be closed, food and water could be in short supply and your property or livelihood could be damaged.
- The strong winds produced by a cyclone (up to 280 kilometres per hour) can cause injury, loss of life, major structural damage to communities, disruption of utility and telecommunication services, and turn debris into dangerous missiles.
- Cyclone activity produces strong onshore winds and flooding rains increasing the threat of storm surge. This is a rapid rise in sea level that accompanies a cyclone as it moves ashore.
- Having an emergency kit is an important step to prepare and protect your household for unforeseen events and is essential for short term survival providing vital items for you, your family or household. It is a good idea to always keep your kit in a handy place known to everyone in the household.
- Cyclone Olwyn was the most significant cyclone to affect the Gascoyne coast in decades. Olwyn impacted Carnarvon on the 13th March 2015, causing minor to moderate damage to homes and infrastructure, significant damage to the power network, disruptions to water supply and significant damages to plantations and cropping.

The warning level will be followed by an action such as "Monitor Conditions" or "Shelter Indoors Now" giving you clear information about how to stay safe. Learning these three levels and how to respond to them could save your life.
