NEW FOOD SAFETY STANDARDS FOR PRIMARY PRODUCTION AND PROCESSING OF BERRIES, LEAFY VEGETABLES, AND MELONS

Registration Required with the Shire of Carnarvon by 12 February 2025

The Shire of Carnarvon advises primary producers of leafy vegetables, melons, and berries within the district that new Australia-wide food safety standards have been developed by Food Standards Australia and New Zealand (FSANZ). These standards, aimed at improving food safety in the primary production and early-stage processing of these products, will come into effect on 12 February 2025.

The new standards apply to businesses of all sizes that are involved in growing or conducting early-stage processing activities, such as washing, trimming, sorting, sanitising, or storing of berries, leafy vegetables, or melons.

As part of these changes, producers of leafy vegetables and melons must legally register as a food business with the Shire of Carnarvon before 12 February 2025. Once registered, businesses will be subject to inspections by Shire officers and must implement a comprehensive food safety management system.

Many producers are already meeting the new requirements through existing industry food safety schemes. However, new registration requirements must now be managed through the Shire of Carnarvon on behalf of the Western Australian Department of Health.

Producers who are not currently certified under an industry food safety scheme will be required to submit a Food Safety Management Statement as part of their registration process. Guidelines on preparing this statement can be found on the WA Health Department website:

Additionally, berry producers and processors must notify the Shire of their contact details, activities, and locations before the compliance deadline.

• Producers are encouraged to complete their registration as soon as possible to ensure compliance with the new regulations and to maintain a high standard of food safety within the region.

PELICAN POINT DUNES REMAIN CLOSED TO VEHICLES

The Shire of Carnarvon has extended vehicle access restrictions at Pelican Point Beach to support ongoing dune stabilisation and vegetation recovery efforts.

Initially implemented in November 2023, these measures have shown promising signs of environmental restoration. However, additional time is required to ensure the success of these initiatives.

The community's cooperation has been instrumental in protecting this valuable coastal area. The Shire plans to conduct another review in 12 months to assess progress.

Previously, in January 2023, the Shire restricted vehicle access to Pelican Point Beach to protect vegetation and potential turtle nesting sites.

The Shire appreciates the community's continued support in preserving this important natural asset.

IMPORTANT NOTICE PROPER DISPOSAL OF BATTERIES

Dear Residents,

Please be advised that batteries must not be placed in your regular rubbish bins. Batteries, particularly lithium batteries, can be dangerous and can ignite without warning when disposed of incorrectly. They can cause fires during waste collection, transportation, handling and processing. This endangers both people and property.

Batteries that show signs of damage including swelling or bulging, leaking, cracks, dents, punctures or crushing should be disposed of carefully. Never throw them in your regular rubbish bins.

Batteries that have had water or liquid ingress or have been submerged in water can also be extremely dangerous and should be treated as damaged. Where possible, remove them from any device or appliance, dry and wipe down terminals to prevent corrosion and short circuiting.

Place leaking or damaged (but not overheated or offgassing) batteries in a clear plastic bag and take them to the waste disposal site.

To ensure safe and proper disposal, a dedicated battery disposal bin will be provided at the Brown Range landfill site. We kindly ask that you use this bin for all types of batteries, including lithium batteries, those from household devices, remote controls, and other electronics.

Your cooperation is crucial in preventing accidents and helping to keep our community safe and the environment clean.

The guys sat down with Shire's Community Emergency Services Manager to discuss lithium battery fires before designing and painting the sculpture. What has resulted is a recycled fridge! "We did this sculpture because we wanted to get people to understand, throwing lithium in the your home rubbish bins is no good!!"

IMPORTANT NOTICE MOSQUITO OUTBREAK FOLLOWING CYCLONE SEAN'S STORM SURGE


The recent mosquito outbreak across the Shire of Carnarvon has been caused by the storm surge from Cyclone Sean, which brought extremely high tides and inundated low-lying coastal saltmarsh areas. These conditions have led to a mass emergence of mosquitoes.

The Shire of Carnarvon has an active mosquito management program, focusing on larviciding, a method proven to be both more effective and environmentally friendly than fogging. While the current mosquito population is expected to naturally decline over the coming weeks, these species are known to travel significant distances, affecting communities across the region.

To protect yourself and your family, remember to Fight the Bite and...

- ✓ Plan Ahead Be aware of mosquito activity in your area.
- Cover Up Wear long, loose-fitting clothing, especially at dawn and dusk.
- ✓ Repel Use insect repellent containing DEET or picaridin when outdoors.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF ROBINSON STREET CORAL BAY JANUARY TO APRIL 2025

The Shire of Carnarvon wishes to advise the community and visitors that a section of Robinson Street in Coral Bay will be temporarily closed to all traffic from 13 January 2025 to 5 April 2025 to facilitate reconstruction works associated as part of the RAC Ningaloo Reef Resort redevelopment.

This exciting redevelopment, led by RAC, includes enhancements to the public road and adjacent facilities, ensuring long-term benefits for both pedestrians and vehicles in Coral Bay.

Key Information:

Scope of Works

- Installation of a towing vehicle turnaround area at the end of Robinson Street,
- New asphalt surfacing for road and parking areas.
- Construction of new kerbing, drainage, footpaths, pedestrian crossings
- Additional vehicle parking.

Road Closure

- The affected section of Robinson Street will be closed to all vehicles.
- Road Users are advised to follow signage and traffic controller directions.

Beach Access

• Pedestrian access to the beach will remain open two existing beach access paths.

Timeline

• Work will commence on 13 January and be completed by 5 April 2025 in time for the Easter 2025 school holidays.

While the Shire recognises the potential inconvenience this temporary closure may cause, these works are critical to delivering enhanced vehicle and pedestrian facilities that will benefit Coral Bay for years to come.

RANGER NEWS

DOG ATTACK

The Shire of Carnarvon encourages residents who are victims of a dog attack to report the matter immediately to the Shire of Carnarvon Rangers at rangers@carnarvon.wa.gov.au or 99410019

When reporting a dog attack please include a description of the dog, date, time and location. These details are imperative so that the Rangers can investigate further.

Your help in reporting these matters will enable the Rangers to monitor offending dogs to ascertain if they are a threat to the community and if so take the necessary action. Dog attack victims are urged to seek immediate medical attention to ensure that the wound/s do not become infected and to also determine if a tetanus shot is required. Not having a tetanus shot in five or more years increases tetanus risk and a booster shot may be recommended.

Here are some suggestions to help should you ever encounter an aggressive dog –

DOG OWNERS

- All dogs can be territorial. Most dog attacks in public occur on the footpath or road in front of the dog's property
- Confining dogs to their property could prevent 80% of dog attacks in public places.
- You can be fined if your dog isn't securely confined, or if it rushes at or attacks a person or animal
- Your dog is to be confined to your property allowing access to your front door.
- When in a public place, your dog must be kept on a lead at all times unless in an approved off leash area.
- While in an off leash area, you must have verbal control over your dog. If your dog does not obey verbal commands, it must be kept on a leash, even in off leash areas.

Know what to do if approached by an aggressive dog

- Stand still, don't run
- Keep your hands by your side
- Stay quiet, try not to make any noise
- Avoid eye contact with the dog, look at the ground
- Once the dog has lost interest, slowly back away



CYCLONE - BE PREPARED!

- On average five cyclones occur off Western Australia's (WA) north-west coast each year, of these, two directly impact the coast and affect local communities. In Western Australia (WA) cyclone season starts in November and continues through to April. During this time coastal regions of WA are at risk of being impacted by cyclones.
- Preparing your family and your property for a cyclone is your responsibility, this includes being familiar with the meanings of cyclone alerts and warnings.
 People also need to take proper precautions and responsibility for their own welfare, prepare property inside and out and develop a cyclone plan to ensure their safety.
- Planning before the cyclone season can help save lives, minimise property damage and help your family to cope during a cyclone.
- Experiencing a cyclone can be frightening and traumatic. After a cyclone, many essential services may not be working, roads may be closed, food and water could be in short supply and your property or livelihood could be damaged.
- The strong winds produced by a cyclone (up to 280 kilometres per hour) can cause injury, loss of life, major structural damage to communities, disruption of utility and telecommunication services, and turn debris into dangerous missiles.
- Cyclone activity produces strong onshore winds and flooding rains increasing the threat of storm surge. This is a rapid rise in sea level that accompanies a cyclone as it moves ashore.
 - Having an emergency kit is an important step to prepare and protect your household for unforeseen events and is essential for short term survival providing vital items for you, your family or household. It is a good idea to always keep your kit in a handy place known to everyone in the household.
- Cyclone Olwyn was the most significant cyclone to affect the Gascoyne coast
 in decades. Olwyn impacted Carnarvon on the 13th March 2015, causing minor
 to moderate damage to homes and infrastructure, significant damage to the
 power network, disruptions to water supply and significant damages to
 plantations and cropping.
