The past few weeks have been quite busy. It was an absolute pleasure to welcome our Governor His Excellency, The Honorable Chris Dawson and Mrs Dawson to our town. I thanked the Governor for the patience, understanding and support whilst in the role of Commissioner of Police and now as the Governor.

Carnarvon Shire is on the cusp of exciting and significant developments, with major developments commencing in Coral Bay which will support tourism in our Shire.

Also underway is the Food Bowl expansion and construction has commenced on the replacement artificial reef here in Carnarvon.

PROJECTS UPDATE



Here you can find all the latest information about our ongoing projects across the Shire. From community facility upgrades to infrastructure improvements and new initiatives, we are committed to keeping you informed every step of the way.

PIONEER CEMETERY FENCING

Thanks to the fantastic feedback from our community, the final design for the Pioneer Cemetery fencing is taking shape. The Shire of Carnarvon is now working closely with utility groups to ensure everything is lined up for a smooth installation. We're on track to kick off works in May and we anticipate wait to see the fencing completed by 30 June 2025.



TRAMWAY BRIDGE RESTORATION PHASE

We're thrilled to announce that the Tramway Bridge restoration is officially underway! Early works are progressing well, with structural and geotechnical investigations already completed, and design planning in motion. Council is now actively exploring funding opportunities to help bring this important project to life.



ARTIFICAL REEF UPDATE

The \$1.4 million Carnarvon Artificial Reef Project is well on track, with a major milestone recently achieved – the successful test pouring of the concrete modules that will form the foundation of the reef.

Tender awardee MMA Offshore has partnered with local Carnarvon company Sweet As Concrete to manufacture the modules, which are now undergoing quality assurance checks.

MMA Offshore has reported the modules are meeting expectations and are pleased with the results so far. Once complete, the reef modules will be installed offshore, with deployment expected by the end of August.

The reef is designed to boost marine biodiversity and provide a new attraction for recreational fishers and divers, supporting both the local environment and tourism economy.

MAINTENANCE GRADING PROGRAM

The Shire's contract grading operator has been hard at work, with maintenance grading on Quobba Gnaraloo Road well underway since mid-March and expected to wrap up by next week.



From there, the team will move straight onto Cardabia Road to get everything festival-ready! After that, it's on to Coral Bay, Warroora, Mia Mia, and Winning Roads, before finishing up at Minilya Lyndon Road.



Kerbing Replacement Program

Exciting improvements are coming to Morgantown! Please be advised that removal of kerbing will begin on Wednesday, 9 April 2025. Once preparation works are complete, the installation of brand-new kerbing will kick off on 5 May 2025, covering areas around Wheelock Way, Morgan Way, Skipworth Street, Morrell Court, and Ridley Place.

In total, 2.4 kilometres of kerbing will be replaced at an estimated cost of \$125,000 — a big step in freshening up our local streets! Residents directly impacted by the works will receive a letter drop with more information.

VAN DONGEN PARK

The new Van Dongen Park will be a true destination park, designed to bring our community together and celebrate our unique identity. Get ready for custom-built, iconic playgrounds that are not only fun but also reflect the spirit of Carnarvon!



There will also be shaded picnic and BBQ areas perfect for family gatherings, plus beautifully landscaped green spaces filled with a variety of native plants.

The Shire of Carnarvon is proud to support local artists through an Artist Capacity Building Programs fostering creativity and community connection.





SHIRE HOLDS SECOND COMMUNITY MEETING

On Tuesday, March 25, the Shire of Carnarvon held its second Community Meeting at the Camel Lane Theatre. Although attendance was lower than expected, those who were present had the opportunity to engage directly with the CEO and President.

The Shire's CEO and President provided a comprehensive update on the current progress and future plans surrounding several important issues.

Among the topics discussed were:

- The Blowholes: The CEO and President offered insight into ongoing efforts and plans related to the Blowholes, emphasizing its significance to the community and tourism.
- Tramway Bridge: An update was provided on the status of the Tramway Bridge, with a focus on restoration and safety measures.

RANGER NEWS

ILLEGAL DUMPING

Illegal dumping is a particular type of littering where people go out of their way to dump their rubbish. It includes waste materials that have been dumped, tipped or otherwise deposited onto land. Illegal dumping varies from small bags of rubbish in an urban environment to larger scale dumping of waste materials in isolated areas, such as bushland.

Report illegal dumping in Carnarvon to the Shire of Carnarvon Rangers on 99410000 during office hours. People who witness illegal dumping should if possible, and without placing themselves at risk, take note of the following:

- date, time and place the offence was committed.
- description of the offender.
- vehicle make, model, colour and registration
- type of litter or nature of the illegal dumping

Illegal dumping can be prosecuted under the Environmental Protection Act 1986 with maximum fines of \$62,500 for individuals and \$125,000 for corporate bodies (businesses). Under the Litter Act 1979 minor illegal dumping can attract an infringement notice of \$500 or \$2,000 if taken to court. Photographic or video evidence will also assist Rangers follow up with any prosecutions that may result from the information.

NEED A RANGER

If you have an urgent matter that needs a Ranger's attention such as snake handling or a dog attack, the Rangers can be contacted on 99410019 or after hours on 99410000 where your phone call will be directed to a call centre for assistance. Please note that this is for urgent matters only and if the matter can wait until Monday, please call during normal office hours 8.00am to 5.00pm Monday to Friday.

LITTER AND THE LAW

Litter is any refuse or general waste that is discarded in an open or public place. Litter can detract from the aesthetics of an area and, depending on the nature and circumstance of the litter, can cause personal injury and/or environmental damage. Illegal dumping includes rubbish dumped at the side of a road, or items left on a verge outside of collection times.

There are many forms of littering and the Shire's Ranger Service will investigate each report. To ensure everyone continues

to enjoy our shire, we've placed litter bins on streets and parks throughout the area.

Litter can include:

- Any material that is thrown or allowed to fall or is blown from a vehicle;
- the placing of waste in a reserve or public place
- the placing of domestic waste in a public rubbish bin
- the placing of bulk waste on your verge before the due date
- dumping of unwanted household, commercial or industrial waste in an open or public place
- throwing cigarette butts on the ground

Littering is an offence under the Litter Act 1979. Did you know littering carries a fine of up to \$63,000 for individuals and \$125,000 for corporations?

The Litter Act 1979 outlines what litter is and what constitutes littering. Littering offences are investigated and actioned by either the Rangers, Police officers or from the Keep Australia Beautiful Council. Illegal dumping is now covered in the Environmental Protection Act.

COUNTRY OF ORIGIN FOR SEAFOOD IN HOSPITALITY SETTINGS - CONSULTATION MARCH 2025

The Department of Industry, Science and Resources is seeking feedback on the proposed mandatory country of origin labelling (CoOL) for seafood sold in hospitality settings. This includes restaurants, cafés and takeaways.

CoOL for seafood will give consumers clear, consistent information about where their seafood comes from. This will help them decide what seafood to buy.

The information standard proposed to be introduced under the Australian Consumer Law will use the Australian-Imported-Mixed (AIM) model. AIM will require hospitality businesses to use a letter – at a minimum – to indicate the seafood's origin:

- ·A (Australian)
- ·I (imported)
- ·M (of mixed origin containing both Australian and imported seafood).

The Department of Industry, Science and Resources is now consulting on an exposure draft information standard and draft explanatory statement that could be used to introduce these changes.

Your feedback will ensure the proposed materials are clear, easy to understand and useful.

WHAT IS CARNARVON COMMON GROUND PROJECT?

Carnarvon Common Ground Project was formed following a series of comprehensive community meetings and collaborative discussions that started in September 2023. This was in response to an increase in crime and youth-related issues within the Gascoyne region. An Aboriginal-led community group began to meet regularly to explore more effective solutions to tackle systemic challenges related to mental health, domestic violence, substance abuse, and the criminal justice system.

The Carnarvon Common Ground Project aims to create an inclusive community strategy that supports both services and local residents and is in the process of rolling out an action plan which includes establishing an Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisation (ACCO) to run the day-to-day operations, partner with services providers and the delivery of identified priority projects.






