### ARTIFICIAL REEF PROJECT TO BOOST FISHING AND TOURISM IN CARNARVON

On Saturday 26 July, Shire President Eddie Smith, Deputy President Burke Maslen and CEO Mandy Dexter met with Ministers Hon Hannah Beazley and Hon Jackie Jarvis, Recfishwest, Fisheries WA, Tim Bray from the Gascoyne Development Commission, and representatives from Cyan Renewables to discuss the upcoming deployment of Carnarvon's new artificial reef.



Thanks to a \$1.4 million investment from the Cook Government through the Recreational Fishing Initiatives Fund, the reef is expected to be installed by the end of August around seven kilometres off Pelican Point. The project has brought together local and State partners, with local business Sweet as Concrete fabricating 300 reef modules that will form a unique underwater habitat.

Designed to attract popular species like cobia, mulloway, and trevally, the reef will create a valuable new recreational fishing hotspot, support marine biodiversity, and help stimulate local tourism and business.

This is a major win for the region and a testament to what strong collaboration between government, community and local industry can achieve.



#### JUNE COMMUNITY MEETING SUMMARY

The Shire of Carnarvon hosted its June Community Meeting on Tuesday 24 June at Camel Lane Theatre, with a strong turnout of residents and staff.

Key updates included progress on town infrastructure such as the Tramway Bridge, kerbing works, Civic Centre upgrades, and electronic signage for remote roads. The Shire also outlined major 2025–26 priorities, including the airport runway upgrade, floating jetty replacement, and the \$18M capital works program—90% of which is externally funded.

The meeting featured a Q&A session covering concerns around mosquito management, Blowholes camping fees, road maintenance, tourism growth, illicit drug use, and power supply resilience. The community also heard updates on the One Mile Jetty, Van Dongen Park upgrades, and the Pier apartments project.

Council encouraged continued public engagement, emphasising that active community participation is vital to addressing shared challenges and shaping Carnarvon's future.

#### YOUTH PRECINCT MAKEOVER: SAFER. BRIGHTER AND **BUILT BY COMMUNITY**

Carnarvon's Youth Precinct has been transformed into a colourful, safer, and more welcoming space thanks to a creative street makeover delivered by the Shire of Carnarvon in partnership with RAC Ignite.

As part of RAC Ignite's Street Makeover program, the project invited local young people, volunteers, and artists to reimagine the space and bring it to life over a week of hands-on activity. Their ideas shaped every element of the upgrade, from design to delivery.

Key features of the makeover include:

- A large sea-themed mural painted on the basketball court, celebrating Carnarvon's coastal identity
- Bright and playful footpath designs to bring joy to the space
- New bike racks to support active transport
- Comfortable seating to encourage relaxation and connection
- Painted planter boxes with fresh greenery, doubling as traffic calming measures to improve safety

This project is a great example of what can be achieved when young people and the wider community are empowered to shape public spaces. The revitalised Youth Precinct now feels brighter, safer, and more inviting — a place where young people can gather, create, and feel proud of what they've helped build.

























#### TURNING PASSION INTO PURPOSE - MEET DENNIS! 🐾

Dennis is a proud Carnarvon local with a deep love for animals and now, thanks to a fantastic partnership between the Shire of Carnarvon and Blue Flax Disability Support Services, that passion has become meaningful work.

Through the Shire's Disability Employment Pathways Initiative, a customised role was created for Dennis at our Animal Impound Shelter, where he helps care for dogs and animals in need.

With support from the Shire Rangers and his Blue Flax team, Dennis is learning the ropes and thriving in his role — and we couldn't be prouder to be part of his journey.

### CARNARVON GETS GROWING FOR NATIONAL TREE DAY

The Shire of Carnarvon proudly celebrated National Tree Day 2025 with two hands-on events bringing together local students, families, and volunteers to green our community and connect with nature.

On Friday 25 July, Schools Tree Day was marked with an enthusiastic planting session at Baxter Park, where Clontarf students worked alongside Shire horticulturalist Kelly. The boys showed strong teamwork, respect, and a clear eye for detail, earning a few quiet nods as potential future depot crew!

The community followed suit on Sunday 27 July, gathering at the Robinson Street Arboretum to plant 300 acacia and coolabah seedlings. Kids, families, and even a few four-legged helpers joined the effort, guided by the knowledgeable team from the Carnarvon Tree Society. With decades of local planting experience, Dave, Kylie, and Les helped make light work of the planting and shared stories about the native flora, including species still awaiting official names. Rumour has it, Les may even have one named in his honour.

The Arboretum, already a favourite for walking dogs and exploring native vegetation, is becoming an even more welcoming space, with fencing upgrades planned to support safe off-leash activity.

On Wednesday 30 July, the Carnarvon Library & Art Gallery marked International Friendship Day with a colourful celebration of connection and creativity. The event brought community members together for a relaxing afternoon of flower arranging, led by the talented Kara from Outback Floral Designs.

#### YOUTH UPDATE

### JULY SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM WRAP-UP

Over two action-packed weeks, the Shire of Carnarvon's School Holiday Program delivered fun, creativity, and connection to local young people — with 26 free activities and an impressive 656 total attendances. Delivered in partnership with Ngala and PCYC, the program was one of our most vibrant and engaging yet.

From creative workshops to high-energy sport, circus skills to comedy shows, there was something for everyone. Here's a glimpse into some of the highlights that lit up July:



### MOVEMENT, MOMENTUM & MAYHEM

The school break kicked off with plenty of energy, thanks to classic favourites like basketball and dodgeball. These fast-paced games proved just as popular as ever, offering a chance to burn off energy and build friendships in a supportive space.

Freestyle Now ran two interactive workshops, one at the pump track, and another at the skatepark. Young people got to test their BMX, scooter, and skateboarding skills while learning safety and repair tips. Highlights included a slow race challenge, group tricks, and helping fix broken parts, reinforcing confidence and care for equipment.

### CIRCUS FUN & JELLY KELLY WHIMSY

The circus rolled into town with workshops in juggling, acro balance, silks, lyera, and hula hooping. Led by experienced circus artists, these sessions brought out resilience, teamwork and laughter — all while building coordination in a fun and supportive environment.

Jelly Kelly brought the colour and comedy, filling PCYC with bubbles, dress-ups, games, and infectious joy. Her face painting booth and tug-of-war rounds were standouts for the younger crowd.









### CREATIVE EXPRESSION THROUGH COMEDY & RHYME

Comedian Andy Jones had kids roaring with laughter in two distinct shows. "The Big Joke Show" had everyone giggling with interactive jokes and stories. In "The Rap n Rhyme Show," kids created their own 20-line songs and performed original jokes, rhymes or poems in small groups. It was a brilliant celebration of language and imagination.





# STORYTELLING MEETS TECHNOLOGY IN WHALEBONE

One of the most thought-provoking experiences came in the form of Whalebone, a theatrical blend of storytelling and science fiction. Using computer animations, robotics, quirky contraptions, and flying objects, this show explored what it means to be human in a digital age. Families came away inspired and curious, with plenty to talk about afterwards.

#### MAJOR PROJECT UPDATE

#### CARNARVON ACTIVATION PLAN (CAP)

#### TRAMWAY WALK TRAIL

The Tramway Walk Trail connects the Tramway Bridge on the Fascine Town Beach to the Carnarvon Heritage Precinct. This project is centred on reinforcing the existing ~2.5km walk into a multi-faceted cultural trail with educational significance. Wayfinding signs, interpretive signs and artwork, viewing points, rest nodes and shade shelters are planned to be located along its length.

Status: Community consultation has been undertaken to inform design and educational content, with detailed design now completed. Tender documentation is currently being drafted.

Next steps: Tender is anticipated to be released in October 2025.

#### **VAN DONGEN PARK**

A destination park focusing on iconic play equipment at an important Carnarvon gateway. Multiple play zones with bespoke equipment and nature plan, public art, turf, trees, BBQ + picnic nodes, public toilets, lighting and parking.

Status: Community consultation has been undertaken, leading to development of the Big Banana Playground concept, with detailed design now complete. Procurement has finalised for fabrication and installation of the Big Banana element. Tender documentation is currently being drafted.

**Next steps:** Tender for the construction of the park is anticipated to be released in October 2025.

#### LOCAL CONNECT & CREATE

Activation of key public spaces including a series of public art installations to encourage exploration and an urban screen to showcase local stories and events to complement 'The Hub', a local making & exhibition space.

Status: An expression of interest process has been completed for the engagement of an artist and delivery of the art concepts. Detailed design is now complete. Procurement has been finalised for the supply and installation of a digital screen which is to be located at the Civic Centre to help promote local events and activities. A Request for Quote to support the construction and installation of the individual art pieces us currently being drafted.

Next steps: A Request for Quote is anticipated to be released in October 2025.

#### OTHER MAJOR PROJECTS

#### TRAMWAY BRIDGE RESTORATION

The Shire of Carnarvon is underway to restoring one of the town's most treasured landmarks: the Tramway Bridge. Restoring the bridge not only honours the past but also offers exciting potential for future community use and tourist attraction.

Status: The project is currently in its second stage, with geotechnical investigations recently completed for the Tramway Bridge; a critical step in planning future repairs. The results of these investigations will help to inform the future engineering and structural design of the restoration.

Next steps: Findings of the geotechnical investigations will help to inform a detailed design of the bridge restoration.



Our Environmental Health team, with the support of a mosquito control specialist, has been working hard to target breeding areas. These larvicide treatments stop mosquito larvae from hatching, helping reduce the number of biting mozzies in our community.

Drawing competitors and supporters from near and far, the carnival combined thrilling clay target shooting with great food, community spirit, and plenty of fun. With over 80 sponsors, supporters, volunteers, and CDSSA members involved, the event highlighted what's possible when the community comes together.

#### PARVOVIRUS OUTBREAK IN CARNARVON - PROTECT YOUR PETS

Carnarvon is currently experiencing a serious outbreak of canine parvovirus (parvo), a highly contagious and potentially fatal disease affecting dogs, particularly puppies. Our local vet **Coral Coast Veterinary Hospital** has reported a significant increase in cases over recent weeks, with many puppies suffering severe symptoms such as vomiting, bloody diarrhea, and dehydration.

Parvo is preventable through vaccination, yet it remains a major risk for unvaccinated pets. The virus can survive in soil for over 12 months and be spread by shoes, tyres, and clothing – meaning your pet doesn't need to come into direct contact with another dog to become infected.

#### What you can do:

- Ensure your puppy is fully vaccinated before socialising or visiting public spaces.
- If your pet shows symptoms such as lethargy, vomiting, or diarrhoea, contact your vet immediately.
- If your dog is not fully vaccinated, please stay home and avoid high-risk areas.

Together, we can help protect local dogs and prevent the further spread of this devastating disease. For advice or to check your pet's vaccination status, contact your local veterinary clinic.



### A BIG THANK YOU TO THE OLD BASTARDS FOR SUPPORTING RFDS

The Old Bastards have once again shown just how much a dedicated group of volunteers can achieve.

In the 2024-25 financial year, the Old Bastards raised an incredible **\$86,800.00** for the Royal Flying Doctor Service, supporting the vital work RFDS does across regional and remote Western Australia.

### REDEVELOPMENT PROGRESS AT RAC NINGALOO REEF RESORT

The transformation of RAC Ningaloo Reef Resort in Coral Bay is well underway, with construction continuing smoothly and minimal disruption to the local area. This significant redevelopment project aims to enhance visitor experiences while supporting the long-term sustainability of Coral Bay's tourism economy.



Recent milestones include the completion of concrete columns and ground slabs for the new Clubhouse and Reception building. Over the coming weeks, pre-cast beams and wall panels will be installed, while additional groundwork continues to prepare the site for the arrival of modular accommodation units later this year.

RAC has assured the community that disruptions from truck movements and site works will be limited, and they remain committed to keeping locals informed throughout the process. The project team has also expressed their appreciation for the community's patience and support as they work to bring this refreshed tourism asset to life.

#### **LEARNING MATTERS WEEK 2025!**

In late 2024, the Shire of Carnarvon was a successful recipient of funding from the *Local Government Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) Grants Program*, which was used to engage an Early Years Project Officer, Gail Law-Davis. She is working alongside the Shire's Library Services and Programs Coordinator, Cheryl Weston, to take the lead on early childhood initiatives, aiming to facilitate stronger early childhood development outcomes for families in the Carnarvon community.



Throughout 2025, Gail has been busily engaging with early years' organisations through the Gascoyne Early Years Network (GEYN) fostering working relationships and sharing details about the AEDC 2024 results. She has participated in several successful collaborative events, including the NAIDOC Week Family Fun Day.

On 30 July, in the lead up to Early Learning Matters Week 2025, Gail held an AEDC Results Workshop with GEYN members, working through the specific data relating to Carnarvon children. Gail led the workshop attendees through the process of understanding the AEDC data (key concepts, data collection, calculating domain and summary indicator results). She also introduced the AEDC Domains, sharing example relevant activities as well as a range of useful resources to support planning and delivery of appropriate programming. The workshop was well-received by all those attending, offering the perfect opportunity for networking and information-sharing.



#### About the AEDC

The Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) is a key national initiative that helps to understand how children are faring in their first year of full-time school – in Western Australia this is Pre-primary.

The AEDC is research-backed tool that tracks the holistic development of young children across Australia. By highlighting strengths and areas for improvement, it provides vital insights that inform policies, programs, and services designed to support children's wellbeing and development.

With data collected every three years, the AEDC gives communities, educators, and governments at all levels the information they need to invest where it matters most, helping all children to thrive.

### PREPARING FOR FIRE SEASON: STAY SAFE THIS SUMMER

As the weather warms up, so does the risk of bushfires across the Shire of Carnarvon. Now is the time for all residents, rural and town, to start preparing properties and reviewing fire safety plans.

From 1 October, the Shire enters its Prohibited and Restricted Burning Periods, during which permits are required and fire safety becomes critical.

We encourage everyone to take proactive steps now to reduce fire risk and be ready in case of an emergency.

- Clear dry vegetation from around your home and sheds
- 🔥 Clean gutters and remove leaf litter
- ♣ Create a 20-metre low-fuel zone around buildings
- b Check and maintain fire-fighting equipment (hoses, pumps, etc.)
- Bushfire Survival Plan
- **W** Know your fire zone and stay alert to emergency warnings


