RESTORATION IN MOTION

The Shire of Carnarvon is excited to announce that restoration works on the iconic Tramway Bridge are continuing to progress.

Shire President Eddie Smith met with Ventia onsite last week, in the next step toward bringing the much-loved bridge back to life. Ventia has been contracted to prepare the detailed design and deliver Stage One of the bridge restoration works and were on site to perform required inspections.

"This bridge means so much to our community, it's part of our identity and our history," said President Smith. "Seeing restoration works underway is a powerful sign of progress. We're not just preserving the past, we're investing in a shared future that honours it."

The Australian Government's regional Precinct and Partnership Program (rPPP) funding has been allocated to support the reinforcement of the





multi-faceted cultural trail, including an allocation towards the first stage of the reinstatement of the Tramway Bridge. The Shire looks forward to providing further updates as the project progresses and thanks the community for its ongoing support.

GASCOYNE COUNTRY ZONE WELCOMES NEW LEADERSHIP


The Shire of Carnarvon recently hosted the November Gascoyne Country Zone meeting, where member councils came together to discuss regional priorities.

At the meeting, Cr Paul Kelly (Shire of Carnarvon) was elected Chair, and President Peter Stubberfield (Shire of Shark Bay) was elected Deputy Chair for the 2025-2027 term.

This was their first meeting in these new roles, setting the groundwork for the goals and collaboration they hope to achieve over the coming years.

The Zone also received updates from WALGA and government agencies and discussed key matters such as regional roads, tourism, and advocacy priorities.





SHIRE OF CARNARVON CREATES LOCAL OPPORTUNITIES THROUGH THE RJED PROGRAM

The Shire of Carnarvon is proud to be delivering new local employment opportunities through the Remote Jobs and Economic Development (RJED) program, a national initiative supporting long-term local job creation in remote communities.

Through this program, the Shire has secured \$3 million in funding over three years (approximately \$1 million per year), enabling the creation of 13 full-time equivalent positions across a range of work areas. This investment is not only supporting local employment but is also being directly

reinvested into our local economy, helping strengthen Carnarvon's economic resilience.

In partnership with Real Futures Pty Ltd and our local schools, the Shire is working to connect school leavers community members with and meaningful, stable employment. Importantly, all RJED employees will have access professional to development opportunities and the ability to undertake formal qualifications, supporting their longterm career pathways.

By building skills and providing real employment options within the community, this program will help grow our local workforce capacity and increase the number of young people to stay in town, build their careers, and contribute to the future of Carnarvon.

16 DAYS IN WA CARNARVON CAMPAIGN

The 16 Days in WA campaign begins today, shining a spotlight on Family and Domestic Violence under this year's theme: Play Your Part.

In the lead-up to the campaign, a collaborative community banner was created at the Community Art Hub with Creative Project Manager Carmen Reilly, bringing together contributions from local organisations, schools, and service providers.

The banner took centre stage during the Gascoyne Women's Refuge White Ribbon March, supported by the Shire of Carnarvon depot team with traffic management to ensure the community could safely move through town. The march drew strong participation, with many residents joining along the way in a show of unity and awareness.

Following the march, the banner joined the GRAMS 16 Days in WA Luncheon, marking the official start of Carnarvon's campaign. It will now remain on display until 10 December as a symbol of the community's ongoing commitment to safety, respect, and support for those affected by Family and Domestic Violence.

ROAD GRADING WORKS UNDERWAY

Our Works crew is currently completing grading across several key unsealed roads, including Edagee Road, EllaValla-Marron Road, Calagiddy-Winderie Road, Meeragoolia Road, and Yalbalgo North Road. These works help maintain safe access for residents, pastoralists, and visitors as we move into the summer season.

We appreciate the community's patience during this period. If you notice areas requiring attention, please contact the Shire so we can prioritise them appropriately.



FARMBOT WEATHER

The Shire has installed several new Farmbot weather stations across the region. We are currently working with the supplier to establish a system that will allow pastoralists to access real-time rainfall data, helping support better decision-making and faster response after weather events.

QUOBBA-GNARALOO ROAD RESHEETING COMPLETED

The Shire has recently completed resheeting along priority sections of Quobba-Gnaraloo Road to improve surface quality, drainage, and overall safety. The project involved importing and compacting new gravel, restoring the road profile, and carrying out targeted drainage upgrades to reduce future washouts.

These improvements provide safer driving conditions, more reliable access for pastoralists and travellers, and reduced long-term maintenance needs. The works are especially timely as the region heads into cyclone and fire season, ensuring this vital coastal route remains accessible when it matters most.



CHRISTMAS LIGHTS SHINE BRIGHT ON MAIN STREET

This year, Carnarvon's Christmas lights are bigger and brighter than ever! From a sparkling cockatoo and festive Christmas train to towering candy canes and a spectacular 6-metre illuminated reindeer, our main street has truly come to life for the festive season.

Painting has never been my thing, but now that I'm older, I think it's grown on me. My very first painting had a very true background and meaning. The ladies at the Art Hub encouraged me to enter it in the Reconciliation Exhibition 2025, and just like that, it sold! I was so excited and wasn't expecting it at all. I just wanted to feel alive again after everything I'd been through.

A few months later, I was checking my emails when I felt that excitement all over again. My piece of art, Connection to Country, had been chosen for the cover of the Reconciliation Action Plan.

BLOWHOLES MAINTENANCE AND NEW CAMPSITE UPDATES

In early November, the Shire's Works crew completed a series of important maintenance tasks at the Blowholes to improve safety, access, and the overall visitor experience. This included levelling several campsites, installing a new drainage system at the Aquarium car park, and ensuring the boat ramp remained clear and accessible for recreational use.

During this time, we also introduced five new general camping sites and six new Members Only sites. These areas were previously designated as car parks, but following community feedback and after observing that they were not being used as intended, they have now been redesigned to better meet visitor needs.

These updates reflect our ongoing commitment to maintaining the Blowholes as a safe, enjoyable, and well-managed destination for both locals and visitors.

MAJOR PROJECT UPDATE

TRAMWAY WALK TRAIL

The Tramway Walk Trail connects the Tramway Bridge on the Fascine Town Beach to the Carnarvon Heritage Precinct. This project is centred on reinforcing the existing ~2.5km walk into a multi-faceted cultural trail with educational significance. Wayfinding signs, interpretive signs and artwork, viewing points, rest nodes and shade shelters are planned to be located along its length.

Stage One: Works to progress the construction and installation of signage and seating along the trail walk was awarded to local contractor Stuart Parker in October. Works have recently commenced, with Stuart collecting recovered timber from the historic One Mile Jetty for use in the project.

A Public Tender to construct the Tramway Shelter and Healing Shelter is currently advertised (closing 12 December), with the tender award anticipated for early 2026. This project has been made possible through a Lotterywest grant of \$763,530.

Stage Two: The Australian Government's regional Precincts and Partnership Program (rPPP) funding has been allocated to support the reinforcement of the existing Tramway Walk Trail into a multi-faceted cultural trail, including an allocation towards the first stage of the reinstatement of the Tramway Bridge. As a critical part of the Trail, connecting town to Babbage Island, the Tramway Bridge stage one works was awarded to Ventia in September 2025. Work has commenced on the detailed design and related site inspections, with restoration works to follow at the Fascine foreshore end of the bridge.

Stage Two: rPPP funding has been obtained to support further park

improvements to ensure the park is an amenity-rich public open space for the

community and visitors alike. The detailed design for Stage Two of the park's

development is underway by H&H Architects. This stage may include elements

such as lighting, vehicle parking, accessible toilet facilities and further

landscaping. A Tender for construction of these additional works will follow in

VAN DONGEN PARK

A destination park focusing on iconic play equipment at an important Carnarvon gateway. Multiple play zones with bespoke equipment and nature plan, public art, turf, trees, picnic nodes, public toilets, lighting and parking.

Stage One: The fabrication of the Big Banana play element is nearing completion and necessary geotechnical investigations to confirm footing design for the structure have been completed.

A Public Tender for construction of the park is currently advertised (closing 12 December), with the tender award anticipated for early 2026.

This project has been made possible through a Lotterywest grant of \$1,807,424.

URBAN FOREST

The Urban Forest focuses on bolstering the quantity of strong street trees set along key arterials, in colourful timber planter boxes and arbors. The combined result is the creation of cool, connected canopies and iconic, activated spaces throughout Carnarvon's CBD, attracting tourists and providing spaces and places for relaxing and consuming local goods. This project will be funded through the rPPP.

Status: A Request for Quote is under development to support detailed design and will be released in the coming months.

FASCINE TO HARBOUR WALK

The Walk will further connect the town centre to the Carnarvon Harbour with a continuous pathway, to further amplify and encourage usage of the town's iconic fascine skyline. The Carnarvon Harbour is already home to tourist-related activities and attractions, but the lack of pedestrian amenity makes it difficult to access without a vehicle. Improving the connection of the Harbour to the town centre will give the existing fascine pathway a more tourist-friendly end destination along with increased recreational use for locals. This project will be funded through the rPPP.

Status: Due diligence investigations and detailed design of the Fascine to Harbour Walk is underway by Projex Partners. A Tender for the project construction will follow this stage of works.

LOCAL CONNECT & CREATE

Activation of key public spaces including a series of public art installations to encourage exploration and an urban screen to showcase local stories and events to complement 'The Hub', a local making & exhibition space.

Stage One: Following artist engagement and detailed design, local contractor W&C Co Mechanical and Civil have recently been awarded works to undertake the construction, coordination and installation of a series of public art pieces for this project. Works have now commenced with the contractor recently collecting recovered timber from the historic One Mile Jetty for use in the project. This has been made possible through a Lotterywest grant of \$786,648.

Stage Two: Funding has been obtained from the rPPP for the next stage of this project, to deliver a locally created art and lighting trail to the local artist hub to complement Stage One of the project and the town's existing public art.

A Request for Quote is under development to support detailed design and will be released in the coming months.

HONOURING REMEMBRANCE DAY

The Carnarvon community came together to honour the courage and sacrifice of those who have served our nation in wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping operations. HMAS SYDNEY II MEMORIAL SERVICE

On 19 November, the Gascoyne RSL Sub-Branch held a commemorative service honouring the 645 Australians lost when *HMAS Sydney II* was sunk in 1941 after an engagement with the German raider Kormoran off the Western Australian coast. Community members gathered to pay tribute to the crew's courage and sacrifice, sharing a toast in their memory and reflecting on their service during World War II. This annual memorial stands as a lasting reminder of their bravery and the significant place HMAS Sydney holds in Australia's naval history.

JUNIOR CRICKET RETURNS TO CARNARVON

After a six-year break due to COVID restrictions, junior cricket has made a strong comeback in Carnarvon, with more than 70 children registered to begin training this week. The revival of Carnarvon Junior Association has been led by local parent and business owner Kara Stalker, who also runs Outback Floral Design. She relaunched the Woolworths Cricket Blast program last year, which grew from 45 participants to 74 this season.

The Shire of Carnarvon has supported with а program \$2,500 contribution to help get them back on the pitch. WA Cricket representative Tia Hatch has provided invaluable guidance throughout the program's rebuild. She recently travelled from Geraldton to run a coaching course for 10 local participants, strengthening the skills and confidence community volunteers. Interest from boys and girls aged 4 to 13 continues to grow, with 20 girls already enrolled.

Plans are also underway for a girls-only program in Term 1 next year. With the popularity of the junior game rising, there is renewed excitement about restarting the senior competition. The community looks forward to seeing the next generation of cricketers hit it out of the park. Training is held each Tuesday from 4.30 pm to 5.30 pm at Baston Pavilion in East Carnaryon.

A NEW ERA FOR CARNARVON'S ICONIC SATELLITE DISH



Power has officially been reconnected to Carnarvon's historic satellite dish, marking the first major step in its transformation after nearly four decades of inactivity. Canadian space company ThothX is preparing to upgrade the dish with deep space radar capability, enabling it to detect objects in geostationary orbit where many of Earth's key communications satellites operate.

Managing Director Phil Youd and Museum Manager Tim Shackcloth said the power connection is just the beginning of an exciting journey. With electricity restored, the team can now install equipment, run transmission tests, and confirm the dish's operational readiness before moving on to full-scale renovations.

The project has generated great excitement and is expected to be a major draw, with 250-300 visitors already coming daily during peak season. And of course, Buzz the cat will be on hand to give everyone a "pur-fect lift-off" into the world of space exploration! This milestone represents an exciting new chapter for the site. Congratulations to ThothX on this remarkable achievement and for bringing new life to a piece of Carnarvon's space history.
