


# Camping in and around Carnarvon...

## Surfing at Redbluff



There is **no free camping** within the Shire of Carnarvon. Please use caravan parks, as we have **seven** of them. Camping is only allowed at designated spots within the Shire of Carnarvon.

**Rocky Pool – day tripping only, NO camping.**

### **South of Carnarvon**

**Wooramel Station – Wooramel Riverside Retreat** – fees apply – 0417 172 208

Located 120km south of Carnarvon, Only located 2km off the Highway. Campsites with over 1km of River frontage and fire pits. Dogs Welcome. Non Potable Water Free. Coffee Shop. Firewood Available. Natural Artisan Hot Spa's. \$12 Per Adult. **You must take all your drinking water, food supplies and fuel.**

**Gladstone** – fees apply – Adult (over age of 16)- \$11 per person per night, Senior/ Pensioners - \$8 per person per night. Children under 16 - Free. 160km south of Carnarvon. Bush toilets.

**You must take all your drinking water, food supplies and fuel.**

### **North of Carnarvon**

**Point Quobba** – fees apply- Adult (over age of 16) - \$11 per person per night, Senior/ Pensioners - \$8 per person per night. Children under 16 – Free. 75km northwest is a magic camping spot located right on the beach, just south of the Blowholes. **You must take all your drinking water, food supplies and fuel and MUST have a chemical toilet.**

**Quobba Station** – fees apply (08) 9948 5098

Located 85km northwest of Carnarvon. There are multiple caravan and camping sites on Quobba. Powered sites are run off the station generator. Power times are approximately 6 - 8am, 12 - 2pm, and 5.30 - 10.30pm. No electrical cooking appliances are allowed, fresh water is available and a common ablutions block is available. No booking / reservations required. Showers, toilets and laundry. Power is \$15 per person, unpowered is \$13 per person. **You must take all your drinking water, food supplies and fuel.**

**Red Bluff** – fees apply (08) 9948 5001

Red Bluff is located 135km North of Carnarvon. Red Bluff caravan and campsites are all located within metres of the beach with spectacular ocean views. All sites have pit fires, toilets within 30 metres and are unpowered. You will need to bring your own water and firewood (for sale at the office) Camping is \$15 per person for unpowered. **You must take all your drinking water, food supplies and fuel.**

**Gnaraloo** – fees apply (08) 9942 5927

Gnaraloo is located 135kms northwest of Carnarvon. Three Mile Camp is camping only with bore water toilets, showers, basic laundry and basic shop facilities. Camping at 3 Mile is \$20 pp, \$10 Children (5-15) (Ordinary Rates) \$25 pp \$12.50 Children (5-15) (Peak Periods, all school holidays). Homestead has no camping. **You must take all your drinking water, food supplies and fuel. Call to confirm prices, availability and road conditions.**

**Warroora Station** – fees apply (08) 9942 5920

Homestead is 175km north and 14 Mile Camp is 213km from Carnarvon. \$10 pp, \$50 per week (2 nights free) Children under 16 free. Prices changed 1<sup>st</sup> July 2014 . **You must take all your drinking water, food supplies and fuel and MUST have a chemical toilet.**

## **Blowholes and Point Quobba**

Located just 75km north of Carnarvon along a bitumen road, this natural phenomenon is awe inspiring sight to see. Powerful ocean swells force water through sea caves and up out of narrow holes in the rocks, jets of water erupt into the air, sometimes to a height of 20 metres, creating a Spectacular sight. Just 1km south of the Blowholes is Point Quobba, a calm coral filled lagoon with fish and shells in abundance. With a white sandy beach this area is ideal for snorkelling, safe swimming, sun bathing and a great family picnic spot much favoured by locals. This is also a camping area with an overnight fee to be paid to the site ranger.

Although the coast is serene it can be deadly, with a dangerous swell that can turn into king waves, capable of crashing over the top of the rock ledge. This coastline needs to be treated with caution and care - lives have been lost by unsuspecting souls here.

## **Quobba Station, Red Bluff, Three Mile and Gnaraloo Homestead**

Heading north of the Blow Holes and Point Quobba, you'll find beachside hideaways at Quobba Station, Red Bluff, Three Mile and Gnaraloo Bay, the southern end of the World Heritage listed, Ningaloo Reef. This magnificent stretch of coastline boasts towering cliffs, rugged coastline, and sandy, white,

Deserted beaches. Great for fishing, surfing, windsurfing, kite surfing, swimming, and snorkelling, whale watching and sight-seeing.

The cliffs provide the ideal platform to view Humpback whales just metres off the coast during their annual migration from June to November. Gnaraloo Station also works closely with DEC to

Protect the local marine turtles that come onto the station lands to nest each year. Camping sites soon fill during the winter months as surfers chase the swell of the warmer northern waters.

Quobba Station is renowned for its ballooning -perhaps the most exhilarating form of land based game fishing. Imagine a surface strike plainly visible to the naked eye, 30kg of Spanish Mackerel

Leaping 8ft clear of the water to smash your bait, hanging below a gas balloon some 30ft above. Regardless of your level of experience every strike will force a spike of adrenalin through you and all

Observing. This coastline is the only places in Australia where you will see the outback meet the ocean.

## **Warroora Station**

Warroora sits to the north of Gnaraloo and south of Coral Bay and can be easily accessed from the Minilya/Exmouth Road. Situated on the Ningaloo Reef, with pristine beaches, an abundance of both wildlife, fish and marine life such as whale sharks, manta rays, turtles and dolphins, Warroora offers something for everyone – fishing, swimming,

Snorkelling, surfing, walking, bird watching or simply relax in a outback setting of your choice.

## **Wooramel**

Discover the unique campgrounds nestled amongst majestic river gums on the Wooramel River. Join in on a 'tag along' mill run tour, do some birdwatching, put your boat in for a fish at Gladstone or just sit back and enjoy the peace and tranquillity of station life.

## **Gladstone Beach**

Gladstone Beach is located 160 km south of Carnarvon and is home to masses of Dugongs who frolic both in the waters near the Old Jetty ruins at Gladstone and also in the sea grass around Carnarvon. Camping at this location is available with a nominal fee provided to the Honorary Ranger on site.
